  - Cropland BMPs Cover Crops: goal 7,373 acres, completed 1,097 acres.

- Josh Peterson added that the City of Sioux Falls would be moving the summit to April and probably be held in Brookings at SDSU. They are working with Vernon Brown to plan for it.
- Jay Gilbertson mentioned that they were ramping up to have the School of Mines sample PFAS at 11 sites along the Big Sioux River from Brookings to HWY 42 bridge in Sioux Falls.

## 6. City of Sioux Falls Bioreactor Presentation and Tour (Chris Schmit).

- Chris gave a presentation on the Bioreactor that was installed in cooperation between the City and SDSU on a city drainage located off of Sycamore Ave. between 61<sup>st</sup> and 63<sup>rd</sup> Street. The bioreactor was designed with the idea that it would remove E. coli and Phosphate from the water. The filter was built in two 20' sections with two 6' spacings between them. The media was 6" deep, comprised of 70% steel slag and 30% steel chips. The the design was supposed to have a 3.85-minute detention time for water to complete the journey through the media.
- Bioreactor was constructed in the spring of 2024 with the first sample taken June 14<sup>th</sup>,
   the second sample taken June 16<sup>th</sup> and 3 additional samples through August.
- Results were shown to remove 27 41% of E. coli and 25 54% of phosphate
  concentrations during the month of June. Results were thought to be influenced by
  above average rainfall at that time. Overall removal for the 5 runs was 44.2 % for E. coli
  and 53.8% for Phosphate.
- There has been talk of a future site at the Sioux Falls Zoo on the oxbow on the west side.
